

The transformation at Baptism

"In Him also you were circumcised with a circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ, having been buried with Him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead." Col. 2:12+13



Our calling is simply to share what we know...

Colossians 4:2-6

"Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains.

Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should. Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone."

The kitchen table One-on-one

- Relationships in the church are easier for a "Churched" culture person
- Newcomers often find relationships in a church intimidating and scary
- People "outside" of the church culture are not looking for relationships IN a church

Relationships

- What does it mean to build a relationship with someone?
 - Be pro-active and notice people and their circumstances.
 - Be a listener and identify ways to connect with others.
 - Be genuinely interested in people and taking care of their needs.
 - Offer to pray for them or with them

- Live a life others will question. Live a questionable life.
- Live a life that evokes curiosity.
 - How do you handle frustration, problems, disappointments, etc.?
 - How do you help others in need, etc.
 - How do you spend your time?

 Are people intrigued by you or your congregation and how they handle, how they help, and how they spend their time?

Church Health and Attitudes

Church Attitudes

- ► Three responses from churches...hopelessness, denial, and indifference (Olson, 2008)
- "Those who think Mosaics will "grow up" and look like everyone else should prepare to be disappointed" (Kinnaman & Lyons, 2007).
- Worship is stale, ritualistic, uninspiring...it is confusing and irrelevant to unchurched who are visiting (Rainer, 2001)
- Christians perceived as, "conservative, entrenched in their thinking, antigay, antichoice, angry, violent, illogical, empire builders" (Kinnaman & Lyons, 2007).

What happened to today's parents? Why aren't they coming back?

- More than 60% of millennials were regular church attendees growing up (Stetzer, Stanley & Hayes, 2009)
- ► Estimated U.S. attendance of 18% as of 2005, projected drop to 15% by 2020 (Olson, 2008)
- Over two-thirds of millennials dropped out of church from ages 18-21 (Rainer & Rainer, 2008)
- "You Lost Me"

Who is God calling you to BLESS?

Intro- Christians are blessed by Christ's love and blessed to share that love with others. Sometimes we may be uncertain about how to share that hope in an authentic and caring manner with someone who does not yet know Jesus or who is quite distant from Him.

Remember to be prepared to give an answer for the hope we have (1 Peter 3:15) but it is the power of the Holy Spirit that is at work. (1 Cor 2:8-10). But how???

Begin with prayer Look for opportunity Engage by listening Serve with love Share the Truth

Begin with prayer- Colossians 4:2 Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful.
