Through the first three quarters of this fiscal year, our congregations have shared freely of more than \$1,337,000 of their precious resources and will likely surpass their own goal of \$1,672,000.

(The current average unrestricted congregation support is \$19.95 per communicant member.)

One-quarter of all unrestricted congregation support (which translates to fifteen percent of our total budgeted expense) is shared directly with Synod in addition to our continued support of the LCMS Office of International Mission's work in the Dominican Republic.

\$1.16M




2024 Budgeted Income
